

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

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

No. 5-M. A. GODFREY, Auckland, 500 Excelsior-J.A.P.


A newcomer to the sport. Has the motor that here Jones rode so well and it can go, so good luck for the first attempt.


- No. 8—P. CLARKSON, Auckland, 500 c.c. Norton.

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
